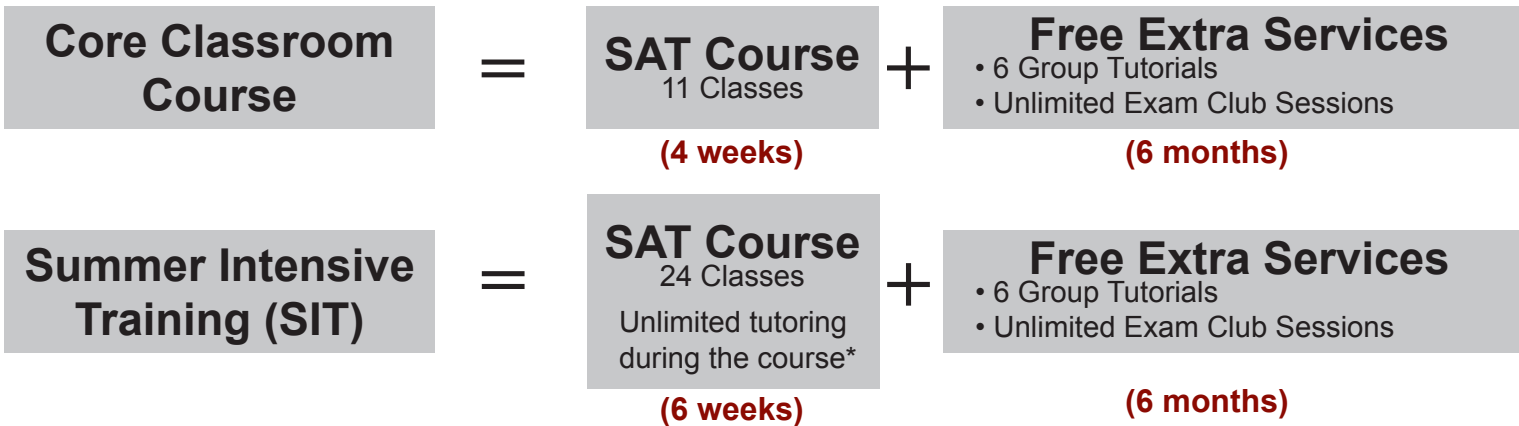

About: The SAT Reasoning Test is used for college admissions. It is the single most important test students take in high school.

Governing Body: The SAT is created by Educational Testing Service (ETS). ETS is paid by the College Board to create the exam.

Test Length: 3 hours (plus 50 minutes for optional essay)

Test Subjects & Format: The SAT has 2 sections: Math and Evidence-Based Reading/Writing.

Grading: Each section is graded on a scale of 200-800. The subtotals from each of the sections are added to form the combined score, with 1600 being the highest possible score. The SAT Essay score is reported separately — one for each dimension: reading, analysis, and writing — ranging from 2–8 points.

Test Dates: The test is offered 7 times a year in: March, May, June, August (starting in 2017), October, November, December. The specific test dates vary by year.

Registration: Register for the official SAT at www.collegeboard.org. It is wise to sign up 6-8 weeks ahead of time to get your preferred test center and avoid late fees.

Test Locations: Students select a test center (usually a local high school) during registration.

Test Fees: The exam fees for 2016-2017 are \$57 (SAT with Essay) or \$45 (SAT without Essay). There is an additional \$28 fee for late registration. (Pricing may vary from year to year. Check the College Board website for the most up-to-date test fee.)

FAQs

Should I take the SAT with or without Essay? We recommend students take the SAT with the Essay; however, to see if your college requires the Writing Test, visit <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register/college-essay-policies>.

When should I start to prepare? It's always important to begin preparing as early as possible so that you have more preparation time to achieve your goals. For students who have the goal of becoming National Merit Semifinalists, it is best to start preparing by June before 10th grade. Otherwise, we recommend starting the summer before 11th grade. Students should begin preparing no later than the summer before 12th grade.

How much high school math do I need before I can start preparing for the SAT?

Once you have completed high school algebra and geometry, you are ready to take the SAT. Although the SAT does include Algebra II, it is only a small fraction of the math section.

What is a good score? A good score on the SAT is one that will get you into the college of your choice, so score goals should be based on which college you want to attend.

How many times can I take the SAT? If the colleges you are planning to apply to only require you to send your highest test scores, you can take the SAT and SAT Subject Tests as many times as you want. If you use Score Choice, colleges will only see the scores you want to send them! If the colleges you are planning to apply to require you to send all of your test scores, we recommend you take the SAT a maximum of three times.

PSAT test facts

About: The PSAT is similar to the SAT, but they are used for different purposes. The SAT is used for college admissions whereas the PSAT determines who can get National Merit Scholarships.

Test Length: 2 hours, 45 minutes

Test Subjects & Format: The PSAT has two sections – Math and Evidence-Based Reading/Writing. The Math and the Evidence-Based Reading/Writing sections of the PSAT are identical to that found on the SAT.

Grading: Each section is scored out of 760 points, making the highest PSAT score a 1520.

Test Dates: The test is offered once a year during October, and students take the test at school during regular school hours. Registration for the PSAT is done through your high school counselor's office in September.

FAQs

Who takes the PSAT? Most students take the PSAT in October of 10th and 11th grades. The 10th grade PSAT doesn't count for anything and is taken just for practice. If you score high on the PSAT during your junior year, you become eligible for the National Merit Scholarships.

How is the PSAT different from the SAT? Both the SAT and PSAT have similar sections. Therefore, if you prepare well for the PSAT, you will be ready for the SAT. While the tests are similar, the purpose of each test is different: the SAT is used for college admissions whereas the PSAT determines who can get National Merit Scholarships.

Why is the PSAT so important? If you score very high on the PSAT you become what is called a "National Merit Semifinalist." Becoming a National Merit Semifinalist is one of the most prestigious achievements a student can have in high school. Achieving this guarantees you a full scholarship at many universities and will help you in gaining admission into the most prestigious colleges. Your 11th grade PSAT is the only chance you have to become a National Merit Semifinalist and receive National Merit Scholarships.

What score on the PSAT is needed to become a National Merit Semifinalist? It varies from year to year and from state to state. To become a National Merit Semifinalist, you must score in the top 0.5% in your state on the PSAT. The National Merit cutoff for any given PSAT is announced the following September after that PSAT is taken.

What is a Commended Scholar? A Commended Scholar means the student did not qualify to become a National Merit Scholar but was top 5% depending on the state.

Do colleges care about my PSAT? Although colleges do not consider your PSAT scores for college admissions, they are interested in seeing whether or not you were recognized as a National Merit Scholar or Commended Scholar.

How much high school math do I need before I can start preparing for the PSAT? The PSAT math section will cover Algebra, Geometry and some Algebra II topics. However, students should start preparing when they have completed Geometry.

When should I start to prepare? It's always important to begin preparing as early as possible so that you have more time to achieve your goals. For students who have the goal of becoming National Merit Semifinalists, it is best to start preparing by June before 10th grade. Otherwise, we recommend starting the summer before 11th grade.

What other factors besides SAT/PSAT scores affect college admissions? Entrance exams are a large part of admissions decisions, but other factors contribute to your appeal. Class rank, extracurricular activities, major, recommendations, essays, and the interview may all influence admissions departments.
